Peter had dug up this tree, potted and kept it untouched in a corner for three years, which is the standard amount of time for him to leave a California untouched in the soil from the dig. He described the harvesting process for California's. He likes to work quickly with power tools in the field, wrap up the tree in plastic and move on.

At home he keeps the tree wrapped in plastic, which allows for moisture preservation. Watering is by misters that he feels simulates night moisture in nature. Direct watering is less frequent perhaps once a week.

His California after some discussion was styled as a wind swept. Dan Kahn won the tree and was overcome with joy.

During the demo Peter chatted about his relationship with Harry Hirao the master of yamadori California juniper and Peter's sensei. It was good to experience his respect and admiration for his mentor. The relationship has changed over the years as Mr. Hirao now 92 has adjusted to aging. Peter has not been in bonsai that long. As I See It


As I See IT Eric Percifield Club President

Naka Notes - Lessons from a Master is Jack Reynold's collection of guidelines primarily from Sansui-Kai founder and master John Naka's texts, **Bonsai Techniques I** and **II** monthly care of your bonsai.

Naka Notes Lessons from a Master by Jack Reynolds

Many trees will go dormant this month. But if your plants have sprouted during the recent warm periods they may need some help. Put your **deciduous** trees in shade and defoliate any that still have leaves by December.

Conifers will not be dormant and will need attention. They will need more water than your dormant trees. But if their foliage starts to yellow cut back on watering and keep on the dry side.

Quick release inorganic fertilizers are ok like 0-10-10 Super Bloom (1/4 tsp. to a gal. with each watering). Quick release inorganic fertilizers are ok like 0-10-10 Super Bloom (1/4 tsp. to a gal. with each watering).

Wiring can be done (careful wood may be brittle) but no **transplanting**. Look for wire digging into branches in all trees. Remove wire by cutting and not unwinding.

October is the last month for **transplanting**. Perhaps quince is an exception. Others allow pot to pot transfer of juniper and black pine.

Junipers can have their **fall clean out and fine wiring**. **Pine candles** can be thinned starting now (David Nguy recommends waiting until December). Remove all but 2 lateral candles on each branch. Old growth **needles** should be removed or shortened as well as unsightly long needles. This will stimulate new buds if the tree is healthy. Remove all but 3-5 bundles of needles on each branch with fewer needles on top branches and more on the bottom branches.

When **frost** is a possibility as temps drop below 50, tropical trees such as Bougainvillea, or Ficus and even Pomegranate should be put under an overhang or inside for brief periods of time.

Tilt your bonsai pots so water will drain more effectively in the **rain** (what's rain).
